### **PREREQUISITES**

### **LEARNING OBJECTIVES**

By student-selected training activities, or electives, are meant activities organised to ensure cultural and disciplinary broadening, to optimise individual preparation and training, and to respond to the personal inclinations of each student. These activities are an integral part of the course of study in Medicine and Surgery, as aiming at learning and deepening specific subjects in accordance with the training programme. By definition, they are activities designed autonomously by the students with the aim of personalising the curriculum. They may vary according to the theoretical and/or practical objectives of the in-depth study. Where applicable, the student must request a certificate of participation for the activities undertaken.

### **LEARNING OUTCOMES**

The elective activities provide students with a wide range of opportunities to develop knowledge, skills and abilities relevant to both their academic career and their future career in medicine and surgery. In particular, participation in these activities will enable students to

Develop skills in organising academic events such as *Le Sicurezze nel Lavoro in Sanita*, educational seminars, Radiation Protection Course, improving ability to plan, manage resources and coordinate activities.

Enhance research skills by participating in research projects which may include data collection and analysis, literature review and presentation of findings.



Expand your knowledge of clinical care settings through participation in UniCaMeetings, lectures by visiting professors and the InterProfessional Education Day (IPE Day), which provides a broader perspective on clinical practice and interprofessional collaboration.

**COURSE STRUCTURE**

The degree course in Medicine and Surgery provides for a total of 8 university credits (ECTS) to be devoted to the student's choice of educational activities in the second, third and fourth years of the course. One ECTS is equivalent to 25 hours.

Participation in seminar activities is compulsory for all students enrolled in the programme.

The Course Council organises and schedules the student's choice of educational



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activities at the beginning of the academic year or, in any case, at the beginning of each teaching period, until the total number of 8 ECTS is reached.

However, students also have the opportunity to propose optional activities that are relevant to the objectives of the course. These activities must not, as a rule, overlap with scheduled teaching activities and must be carried out in person.

### **OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES**

The optional activities are subject to an evaluation, which will be entered in the student's career with the word idoneo, allowing the acquisition of the annual CFUs foreseen in the study plan. All the activities proposed by the Teaching Management are valid for the acquisition of credits, while those undertaken on the student's own initiative must be assessed in advance by the Teaching Management, which will inform the student of the eligibility of the activity undertaken. In order for the latter to be effectively recognised, it is necessary to proceed by uploading the documents attesting to the actual participation.

### **SUPPORTING ACTIVITIES**

Students will have the opportunity to undertake theoretical/practical exercises and participate in seminars or workshop activities.
