ERASMUS+ CALL FOR THE SELECTION OF STUDENTS FOR TRAINEESHIP MOBILITY (EU) FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027 (deadline: 1 October 2026 - 11:00 am)

THE RECTOR

HAVING REGARD TO the Statute of Saint Camillus International University of Health Sciences, hereinafter referred to as UniCamillus University;

HAVING REGARD TO the University's Teaching Regulations;

HAVING REGARD TO the Code of Ethics and the Organization, Management and Control Model 231 of UniCamillus University;

HAVING REGARD TO the granting of the Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) by the European Commission for the period 2021-2027, which is a prerequisite for accessing funding under the Erasmus+ programme;

DECREES

Article 1

The approval and issuance of the Erasmus+ Call, Mobility for Traineeship purposes (*Erasmus+ for Traineeship*) to be carried out in the academic year 2026/2027, the text of which, attached to this Decree, forms an integral part thereof.

Article 2

This Decree, bearing an original signature, is filed in the appropriate register of this University and published on the institutional website.

ERASMUS+ TRAINEESHIP CALL FOR THE SELECTION OF STUDENTS FOR TRAINEESHIP MOBILITY FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2026/2027

The Erasmus+ programme for traineeship purposes allows university students to increase their training opportunities, aimed at acquiring the skills needed to facilitate the transition into the world of work.

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Article 1 – Purpose

UniCamillus University announces under Key Action 1 of the Erasmus+ Programme, a selection procedure for the award of international mobility places to carry out traineeship activities abroad, each lasting a maximum of 3 months, to be carried out in the A.Y. 2026/2027.

The mobility periods provided for by this call are governed by the Erasmus+ Programme Regulation 2021-2027 of 28/05/2021.

The conditions set out in this Call may be amended or supplemented following official communications from the Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE (hereinafter referred to as the NA) regarding updates to the ERASMUS+ 2021-2027 Programme by the European Commission.

Payment of the Erasmus+ EU Contribution and the amount of the grant are subject to the actual disbursement of EU funding by the NA.

In the event of non-disbursement or partial disbursement of funds by the funding bodies, the University reserves the right to pay students amounts in proportion to what has actually been received.

Article 2 - General and admission requirements

Students regularly enrolled for the A.Y. 2026/2027 at UniCamillus University may participate.

Students who have already graduated may not apply for a traineeship under this Call.

To benefit from the EU contribution, the student must:

- a. not receive, during the same period, an EU contribution provided by other programmes or actions funded by the European Commission, or a grant under other international mobility programmes of the University and/or programmes equivalent to those of the University;
- b. not have already used the maximum number of mobility months allowed by the Programme in their study cycle¹.

This call is addressed to:

- Master's Degree Course in Dentistry and Dental Prosthetics:

students enrolled in the 5th and 6th year for the A.Y. 2026/2027 who meet the following requirements:

- a) be up to date with enrolment and the fees due for the A.Y. 2026/2027;
- b) hold, at 30/09/2026, a minimum number of credits equal to:
 - **210 ECTS** for students enrolled in the 5th year in the A.Y. 2026/2027;
 - **270 ECTS** for students enrolled in the 6th year in the A.Y. 2026/2027;

- Master's Degree Course in Medicine and Surgery:

students enrolled in the 5th year for the A.Y. 2026/2027 who meet the following requirements:

- a) be up to date with enrolment and the fees due for the A.Y. 2026/2027;
- b) hold, at 30/09/2026, a minimum number of credits equal to **210 ECTS**;

- students enrolled in the 3rd year for the A.Y. 2026/2027 in the bachelor's degree in Nursing who meet the following requirements:

¹ ERASMUS MONTHS: Students have 12 months of Erasmus+ international mobility per study cycle of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd level. The 12 months include both study mobility and traineeship mobility. Students have 24 months of Erasmus+ international mobility for the single-cycle degree course. The 24 months include both study mobility and traineeship mobility.

- a) be up to date with enrolment and the fees due for the A.Y. 2026/2027;
- b) hold, as of 30/09/2026, the following requirements
 - **60 ECTS** and have passed the Clinical Practice 1 (first year) and the Clinical Practice 2 (second year) exams.

Please note that students selected for Erasmus mobility are required, even during the mobility period, to regularly renew their enrolment/pay the fees due for the A.Y. 2026/2027 in accordance with the deadlines set out in the applicable Tuition and Fees Regulations. Failure to renew enrolment will make it impossible to recognize the traineeship activities carried out under the Erasmus+ mobility programme.

Article 3 – Available destinations

For destinations, please refer to Annex A of this Call.

It is not permitted to carry out the mobility in one's own country of origin/birth and residence.

Further useful information on destinations:

- **Mobility to France:** under French law <https://www.service-public.fr/professionnels-entreprises/vosdroits/F20559>, the receiving organization must pay the trainee if the mobility lasts more than 2 months (corresponding to 44 actual working days).
The fact that a student is carrying out an Erasmus+ internship/traineeship does not exempt the host company from complying with French law; indeed, there is no specific status for an Erasmus+ trainee in France.

Successful students are reminded that they may (and must) contact the host universities only after the Erasmus Office has sent the nominations of the winners to the respective institutions and these have confirmed acceptance of such nominations. Successful students are advised to pay close attention to the instructions provided by the partner coordinators and to monitor the academic calendars of the host universities.

Non-European students who intend to participate in the Erasmus+ Traineeship will be required to go to the Embassies of their country of origin to obtain the entry visa for the countries where the mobility is to take place, with no further costs or responsibilities for the University.

Article 4 - Application procedures and deadlines

Students interested in applying to participate in the Erasmus+ Call must log in with their credentials to the GOMP student portal (<https://unicamillus-studenti.gomp.it/Login>) and follow the path home > international mobility > mobility call.

The application must be submitted from the publication of this call until 01/10/2026 by 11:00 am.

Once the application has been completed, the system will provide confirmation of submission. The student may print the summary of the application and/or download a reminder of it.

Interested students may submit only one application, in which they may select one destination, chosen from those listed in Annex A.

The choice made at the time of application is binding for the purposes of the grant award.

Grants will be disbursed until the total number of monthly instalments provided for has been exhausted.

Applications containing incomplete or untrue information will be considered void.

Students must attach to the application, **at the time of application**:

- a certificate attesting adequate language skills based on the chosen destinations, since proven knowledge of the language of the host university's country is required.

The specific language proficiency for the destination chosen at the time of application must be certified by an official certificate to be attached to the application. Specifically, for example:

English: IELTS, TOEFL, Cambridge (FCE, CAE, CPE);

Spanish: DELE;

French: DELF / DALF, TCF, TEF.

If students do not have the language certification required by the host university, they may upload a self-certification form in which they undertake to obtain this certification by 30 November 2026. If this certificate is not provided, the student who has been awarded the Erasmus+ mobility grant will lose the benefit.

Students with a secondary school leaving certificate obtained abroad will be automatically classified at level C1 on presentation of their certificate (self-certifications cannot be accepted).

N.B. Please note that the submission of the application is the sole responsibility of the candidate. Applications will be considered void if they are:

- incomplete and/or not shown as "Validated" (closed) online at the time the Call closes;
- not correctly filled out in the format required by the system;
- containing false statements or documentation.

It will not be possible to modify submitted applications; the application must be cancelled and resubmitted.

Article 5 - Criteria and evaluation of applications

To drawing up the ranking lists, applications received in compliance with the procedures and deadlines set out in this Call will be examined by a special internal Committee appointed by the Rector and set up separately for each degree course, according to the following evaluation criteria:

- a) ECTS credits acquired (from 0 to 30 points);
- b) weighted grade average (from 0 to 30 points);

The final score awarded to each application for the purposes of drawing up the ranking list will therefore be the sum of the scores relating to points a) and b), for a maximum of 60 points.

a. Academic career

For the assessment of academic career, the result obtained from the formula below will be taken into account, which estimates the ratio between the credits obtained during the academic career (by the deadline of the call) and the total credits achievable as set out for the year of enrolment.

(based on the study plan of the academic year of enrolment)

Please note that the system will automatically record as credits obtained only those actually recorded in the academic career (visible on the Gomp portal) by the deadline of the call.

Students are required to check the progress of the recording of recently taken exams and to request timely closure of the exam records. For exams taken some time ago but not yet recorded/closed on Gomp, immediately contact the relevant professor or the relevant Teaching Office.

Based on the value obtained from the ratio expressed above (ECTS obtained/ECTS achievable), each student will be awarded the score (from 0 to 30) indicated in the table below.

b. Weighted grade average

The score (from 0 to 30) assigned to the specific value (including decimals) of the weighted grade average contributes to the final score.

Article 6 - Ranking list

The ranking list will be published by 15/10/2026 on the website www.unicamillus.org in anonymous form. Students who have duly submitted their application will be able to view their ranking through their student ID number. The ranking list will indicate the position, the score obtained and, only in the case of an “Admitted” student, the assigned destination.

In drawing up the ranking list, in the event of a tie, priority will be given to the student who has never benefited from international mobility during their study cycle. In the event of a further tie, priority will be given to the student enrolled for the A.Y. 2026/2027 in the less recent cohort (e.g. a student enrolled in the 3rd year will have priority over a student enrolled in the 2nd year). Finally, again in the event of a tie, precedence will be given to the youngest student.

Those who are placed in a useful position with reference to the number of places available at the host University will be considered “winners”.

Those who, on the basis of the score obtained, do not turn out to be winners due to the exhaustion of available places and/or resources, will be considered “eligible”. Such students may become winners following additional funds and/or withdrawals.

Candidates who do not meet the requirements set out in Art. 2 of this call will be considered “not eligible”.

NB: Please note that assignment or eligibility in the ranking list does not guarantee the student's mobility, and that such mobility is subject to the following condition:

- submission of the LA and acceptance by the host Institution and by UniCamillus.

Article 7 - Acceptance of the mobility grant

All communications between candidates and the Erasmus+ Office will take place via the email erasmus@unicamillus.org.

Following the publication of the selection results, selected students must communicate their acceptance without exception within 3 days of the publication date of the ranking list, following the procedures indicated in that communication.

Those who do not comply with the above deadlines will be considered to have withdrawn for all legal purposes, and the Erasmus+ Office will proceed to award the contribution to the eligible students on the reserve list.

Eligible candidates who take over will be required to comply with the timeframes and procedures set out for winners.

Acceptance of the mobility is a serious commitment made by the candidate. After acceptance or at the start of the mobility period, students may withdraw only for serious and proven cases of force majeure, to be communicated in writing and duly justified, so as to allow the first candidate on the reserve list to take over in due time.

Failure to accept by the deadline indicated in this article will be considered an automatic withdrawal. In this case, the Erasmus Office will proceed to assign the mobility to the following students on the ranking list, who may therefore be contacted.

NB: In any case, the student's mobility is subject to acceptance or otherwise by the host University/institution, which may reserve the right to request further certifications/documents or even to reject the application.

Article 8 - Withdrawal, replacement and sliding down the ranking list

Students awarded the Erasmus+ scholarship for traineeship student mobility who decide to withdraw from the grant award are required to promptly communicate their **Withdrawal from Mobility** to the Erasmus Office: erasmus@unicamillus.org.

The communication must be sent solely and exclusively from the institutional email account assigned to each student.

Remaining available places will be assigned by moving down the ranking list or by issuing a new notice. Under no circumstances will it be possible to exchange the destination obtained with that chosen by another student.

The holder of the Erasmus+ grant forfeits it if any of the following occurs:

- loss of student status;
- withdrawal from the Erasmus+ grant;
- stay of less than 2 months (60 days);
- any duly justified cause that makes the student ineligible to continue their stay abroad.

Article 9 – Mobility

The duration of the mobility must be at least 2 months (equal to 60 days) and must end without exception by 31/07/2027.

Mobility may only be carried out in the second semester (subject to the deadlines and timeframes set by the partner universities) in the following periods:

- Medicine: from February 2027 to July 2027.
- Dentistry: from February 2027 to July 2027.
- Nursing: from February to April 2027 or from June 2027 to July 2027

9.1 - Before mobility

Before departure, the student must:

- Have completed and signed the Learning Agreement in agreement with the relevant Registrar's Office, which must approve the proposed traineeship activity;
- Sign the Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility Financial Agreement;
- Inquire with the competent authorities regarding any requirements connected to the immigration regulations of the host country, in the case of non-EU citizenship.

Learning Agreement or LA – Must be completed and approved by the host institution and by UniCamillus University;

Mobility Financial Agreement – This agreement will be filled out by the student when

accepting the chosen destination. The agreement will be completed with personal and financial details and signed by the University and by the student before departure.

9.2 - During mobility

As soon as the student arrives at the destination, they must have the Arrival Certificate completed and signed by the relevant offices of the host institution and send it to erasmus@unicamillus.org within 7 days of arrival, in order to avoid delays in the disbursement of the grant.

9.3 - Return from mobility

Within 15 days of returning from mobility, in order to initiate the recognition of the traineeship carried out abroad, the Erasmus+ Office must obtain:

- Certificate of Attendance: the attendance certificate must be sent by the student to erasmus@unicamillus.org. The document must be signed and stamped by the host University and must show the exact start and end dates of the mobility;
- correctly completed traineeship attendance sheets;
- ToR: Transcript of Records;
- The student must also have completed the "Participant Report" directly on the website communicated by email by the EACEA.

Curricular traineeships will be certified by the Internship Certificate (attendance sheet), preferably with the stamp and signature of the department attended.

Recognition will be carried out as follows:

Article 10 – Student obligations and useful information

The student must independently carry out the registration procedures required by the host University in accordance with the procedures and deadlines it has set. The student must independently arrange accommodation for the traineeship period abroad or contact the host

University to check the availability of student residences and/or accommodation search services.

The student must also:

- check the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation for any notices regarding safety and risk situations at <https://www.viaggiareassicuri.it> concerning the destination;
- review and accept any mobility conditions set by the host University/institution;
- take out travel insurance covering cancellations or delays due to epidemics, pandemics or other force majeure causes;
- Independently find out about the requirements for the issuance of an entry visa for the destination country: this obligation applies in particular to non-EU students and/or EU students who must travel to a European destination outside the Schengen area;
- independently find out about healthcare in the host country, by contacting their local health authority (ASL) or the diplomatic representations. Students are in any case advised to find out, before departure, about the extent of National Health Assistance in the destination country. Basic healthcare and direct access to national health services in EU member countries is generally guaranteed by the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). It will be the student's responsibility to obtain this card if they do not already have one, or if it has expired or been lost. Please note that this card may in any case cover medical/hospital assistance expenses in different ways and to different extents depending on the destination country; any further insurance coverage (for example, coverage of risks connected with the practice of the medical profession and healthcare facilities) must be arranged directly by the trainees;
- Proceed, even during the mobility period, to renew enrolment/pay the university fees for the A.Y. 2026/2027 in accordance with the deadlines set out in the applicable Tuition and Fees Regulations.

Accident and civil liability insurance

The accident and civil liability insurance that the student benefits from upon enrolling at UniCamillus is extended, under the same terms, for the entire period spent abroad at the host Institution.

Online Linguistic Support (OLS)

Erasmus+ strengthens the support offered to participants in mobility activities to improve their foreign language skills before and during their stay abroad through a European online linguistic support service (OLS), which offers participants in mobility activities the opportunity to assess their knowledge of the language they will use abroad, as well as to take a free online language course to improve their skills. To take the test and follow the language courses, students must register on the EU Academy platform.

Article 11 – Financial Contribution

11.1 – How the financial contribution is disbursed

The financial contribution for the mobility period is disbursed through funds allocated by the Erasmus+ National Agency and by the MUR – Ministry of University and Research:

The actual contribution is calculated on the basis of the days of mobility actually spent abroad, as shown in the Attendance Certificate issued by the host university/institution. Payment will depend on the actual receipt of the funds.

The disbursement of funds takes place in two tranches:

- the first, equal to 70%, at the beginning of the mobility period, upon sending to erasmus@unicamillus.org the Confirmation of Registration and Stay Form (*Certificate of Attendance*) completed and signed by the host Institution in the section relating to the arrival date;
- the second, equal to 30%, at the end of the mobility period, following receipt by the Erasmus+ Office of the *Certificate of Attendance* (and in any case no later than 10 August 2027) and completion by the student of the Participant Report.

A bank/postal account held solely or jointly by the successful student must be indicated (accounts held exclusively by parents/others cannot be used).

In the event of early termination of the stay abroad, the amount of the grant is recalculated in proportion to the period actually spent.

Furthermore, if the successful student decides to spend a period shorter than that planned in the Agreement (but still longer than 2 months), they must, if necessary, return part of the funds that exceed the amount received in advance.

Please note that winners of the Erasmus+ grant who spend an actual period of mobility abroad of less than 2 months (60 days) must return the entire amount received in advance, as they will not be entitled to any Erasmus+ Project funds, and the traineeship activities carried out will NOT be recognized.

The duration of the grant is calculated based on the start and end dates of the traineeship (day/month/year) according to the 360-day commercial year; therefore, each month, regardless of its actual length, will be considered as 30 days. In the case of incomplete months, the financial contribution will be calculated by multiplying the number of days of the incomplete month by 1/30 of the monthly unit cost.

Any periods of extension of the Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility beyond the initial agreement signed by the student will not be covered by the Financial Contribution.

The University may, however, proceed to reallocate any remaining funds sufficient to cover the extension months and/or mobility periods without a contribution.

Students with fewer opportunities

In line with the national provisions attached to the Erasmus+ Programme Guide, participants with fewer opportunities will be considered those who fall into one or more of the following conditions:

- participants with certified physical, mental and health problems;
- participants with an economic disadvantage established by ISEE (up to €27,948.60);
- cultural differences, e.g. individuals from a migrant background and refugees, national or ethnic minorities, people with difficulties in linguistic adaptation and cultural inclusion, etc.
- students with minor children;
- working students;
- students who are professional athletes
- students who have lost at least one parent
- students who are children of victims of terrorism and organized crime

PLEASE NOTE: *The above conditions must be certified by specific documentation and a related self-certification, which will be provided upon publication of the ranking lists.*

Students with fewer opportunities will receive a top-up to the individual contribution allocated for physical Erasmus+ Traineeship mobility equal to €250 per month, in addition to the basic monthly contribution.

Zero-grant students

If the availability of EU funds is not sufficient to cover all the assigned monthly instalments, some students may not receive the EU contribution ("zero grant"), or may receive only a portion of it. In both cases, the student, while meeting all the mobility criteria set out for Erasmus+ students, will still benefit from the status of Erasmus+ student (but not the financial contribution) and all the benefits associated with it.

If there is no sliding down of the ranking list, eligible students may request to participate as "zero grant" students, still benefiting from the status of Erasmus+ student and all the benefits associated with it.

11.2 – Travel contribution

In order to make international mobility inclusive and sustainable, specific contributions are provided to support travel expenses for the purposes of carrying out Erasmus+ mobility.

In this regard, it should be noted that the Erasmus+ 2021/2027 programme aims to encourage green transport, i.e. modes of travel with low CO2 emissions (such as train, car sharing, bus):

- a green trip is understood to mean solely a trip made by bus and/or train, provided that such means were used for the majority of the route, in terms of distance travelled, for both the outbound and return journeys. Those who make a trip that qualifies as green must keep and present the travel tickets at the end of their mobility.

Please note that the travel tickets submitted must show that the outbound journey took place on a

date prior to or coinciding with the start of the mobility, while the return journey took place on a date coinciding with or after the end of the mobility.

For a “standard” trip (by air transport), a unit contribution is provided per distance band: the amount paid for the round trip between the place of departure and the place of destination.

The amount is calculated for each individual distance band *as a one-off payment* as follows:

The distance must be verified using exclusively the calculation tool provided by the EC, available at the following web address: <https://erasmus-plus.ec.europa.eu/resources-and-tools/distance-calculator>

The amounts may be subject to change based on the NA's provisions.

Example of calculation of the contribution for travel standard

- City of departure: Rome
- City of destination: Oslo
- Distance detected by the calculator (Rome–Oslo): 2013.69 km
- Corresponding band: 2000 and 2999 KM
- Eligible contribution: €395.00 (round trip)

11.3 – Waiver of the contribution

Acceptance of the mobility, as set out in the Agreement, is a serious commitment made by the candidate. Assigned students who accept the EU contribution, sign the Agreement and subsequently intend to withdraw from the traineeship period abroad must complete and submit the Withdrawal Form accompanied by adequate certification. If the certification is not provided, or if the reasons are not considered valid, students who withdraw, in addition to being required to immediately return any amounts received, will no longer be able to apply for a grant under the Programme.

Article 12 - Students with disabilities and inclusive education

In accordance with the provisions of the decision establishing the Erasmus+ Programme, in order to allow broader participation in mobility programmes, the Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE may provide an additional financial contribution for students with disabilities who request it. These are contributions allocated by the European Commission and intended for those with

specific physical, mental or health conditions. To access them, a specific request must be submitted to the University's Erasmus+ Office, in accordance with the procedures and timeframes defined by the Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE.

It is established practice for the sending institution to ensure that the receiving institution takes the necessary steps to meet the particular needs of the person concerned, provided that the latter has communicated their physical, psychological or health conditions.

Article 13 - Person responsible for the procedure
