THE RECTOR

HAVING CONSIDERED the Statutes of the Saint Camillus International University of Health Sciences, hereinafter referred to as UniCamillus;

HAVING CONSIDERED the Teaching Regulations;

HAVING CONSIDERED the Code of Ethics and the Organisation, Management and Control Model 231 of UniCamillus University;

HAVING CONSIDERED the granting of the Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) by the European Commission for the period 2021-2027, which is a prerequisite to apply for funding under the Erasmus+ programme;

DECLARES

Article 1

The approval and publication of the Erasmus+ Call for applications - Academic Year 2025/2026, Erasmus+ Short Mobility Call within a Blended Intensive Programme (BIP) for the MSc in Medicine and Surgery – 6th year and the BSc in Nursing – 3rd year, the text of which is attached to this Decree and constitutes an integral part thereof.

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The Erasmus+ Study Mobility Programme enables university students to broaden their training opportunities, with the aim of helping them to acquire the necessary skills to facilitate their successful transition into the professional sector.

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Article 1 - Purpose

Blended Intensive Programmes (BIP) are short, intensive transnational study programmes consisting of an in-person activity and an online component.

The actual mobility will be subject to the signing of a bilateral agreement with the Wrocław Medical University (Erasmus+ code: PL WROCLAW05), which has not yet been finalized.

Programme contents:	The project is designed around a scenario involving the murder of an unidentified woman (represented by a mannequin). Participants will have the opportunity to follow the entire investigative process—from examining the crime scene and collecting evidence to conducting an autopsy, analyzing biological and toxicological samples, and ultimately determining the identity of the deceased. The project aims to showcase a comprehensive approach to forensic science, highlighting techniques for identifying human remains and analyzing crucial evidence in criminal investigations.

Programme contents:	This Blended Intensive Program (BIP) explores the diverse and evolving actions

of public health through a combination of 3 days of online learning and 5 days of on-site sessions. The structure allows students to engage with international peers and experts, combining theoretical foundations, interactive discussions, and practical applications. This course aims to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of multidisciplinary public health actions; to understand evidence-based foundations of public health; to enhance awareness of socio-economic, environmental and ecological determinants of health, to discuss and prepare to tackle current public health challenges, especially medical misinformation and infodemics. Structuring the course into daily thematic modules ensures a logical progression: from understanding the foundations of population research, through exploring public health actions across history, to considering environmental impacts and modern challenges. The final integration module synthesizes insights, encouraging participants to apply their learning in multidisciplinary contexts.

Article 2 – General and Admission Requirements

This Call is addressed to students enrolled in A.Y. 2025/2026 in:

- BIP n. 1: MSc in Medicine and Surgery, 6th year and have passed the Forensic Medicine exam and have a weighted average of the exams equal to or higher than 25;
- BIP n. 2: Bsc in Nursing, 3rd year

who meet the following requirements:

- a) regular enrolment and payment of tuition fees for A.Y. 2025/2026;
- b) not having exceeded the maximum Erasmus+ mobility duration (12/24 months per study cycle);
- c) not being beneficiaries of other EU-funded mobility grants overlapping with the BIP period.

Article 3 – Application Procedure and Deadline

Students interested in submitting an application to participate in the Erasmus+ BIP call for applications must access the GOMP portal (<https://unicamillus-studenti.gomp.it/Login>) with their login details and then click on home > mobilità internazionale > studio > bando Erasmus+ BIP **till February 27th 2026 at 1:00 pm.**

Once the application has been completed, the system will send confirmation of successful submission. Students can print a summary of the application and/or download a copy of the application.

Interested students may submit **a single application.**

Please note: Submission of the application is the sole responsibility of the applicant. Applications will be considered invalid if they are:

- incomplete and/or not validated (closed) online by the time the call is closed;
- not properly completed as required by the system;
- contain false information or documentation.

It is not possible to modify or cancel applications submitted after the call is closed.

Student mobility to a university in the country of residence is not allowed.

Article 4 - Criteria and evaluation of applications

For the purpose of preparing the rankings, applications submitted in compliance with the procedures and deadlines set forth in this Call will be examined by a dedicated internal Committee (composed of the University Erasmus coordinator, the Dean of the Degree Program,

and the Academic Manager of the Degree Program) according to the following evaluation criteria:

- a) academic career (from 0 to 30 points);
- b) weighted average marks (from 0 to 30 points).

The final mark awarded to each application for the purpose of drawing up a ranking list will therefore be the sum of the marks awarded for points (a) and (b), up to a maximum of 60 points.

- **Academic career**

The academic career will be evaluated according to the formula below, which estimates the ratio between the ECTS credits obtained during the career (up to the deadline for submission of applications) and the total number of ECTS credits that can be obtained in the year of enrolment.

ECTS credits obtained
(by the deadline for applications)

ECTS credits to be obtained
(based on the study plan of the academic year of enrolment)

Please note that the system will automatically consider as credits obtained only those actually registered in the student's record (visible on the GOMP portal) by the deadline of the call for applications.

It is the student's responsibility to check the progress of the record of recently taken examinations and to request the closure of the record in good time. For examinations taken time ago but not yet registered/closed on the GOMP portal, please contact the lecturer or the relevant Teaching Services office immediately.

According to the value obtained from the ratio expressed above (ECTS credits obtained/ECTS credits to be obtained), each student will be assigned the score (from 0 to 30) indicated in the table below.

Table a) - Score awarded for academic career

b. Weighted average marks

The score (from 0 to 30) assigned to the point value (including decimals) of the weighted average marks contributes to the final mark.

Table b) - Score assigned to the weighted average mark

The final score for each category when the ranking list is drawn up will therefore be the sum of the scores obtained in the academic career check (a) and the weighted average check (b), up to a maximum of 60 points.

The ranking list will be published anonymously on www.unicamillus.org by 06/03/2026. Students who have duly applied will be able to consult their ranking by means of their student ID. The ranking list will indicate the position, the score obtained and, only in the case of a 'selected student', it will be written WINNER.

In the event of a tie, priority will be given to the student who has not benefited from international mobility during their studies.

For BIP No. 1 only, in the event of a tie, priority will be given to the student who has obtained the highest grade in the Forensic Medicine exam.

In the event of a new tie, priority will be given to the student with the youngest age. Applicants will be considered “**successful candidates**” if they rank within the number of available places offered by the host university.

Candidates who, on the basis of the number of points obtained, are not successful because there are no more places available in the locations they have chosen, will be considered 'eligible'. In the event of an increase in the number of places available due to withdrawals, the University reserves the right to rotate the eligible students according to the order of the ranking list or, if the number of places available is exhausted, to publish a new call for applications.

Candidates who do not meet the requirements set out in art. 2 of this notice will be considered 'ineligible'.

Please note: ranking assignment does not guarantee mobility of the student as such mobility is subject to the following conditions:

- acceptance by the host institution,
- Possibility of ECTS credit recognition upon return to the home university;
- the signing of a bilateral agreement between UniCamillus University and Wrocław Medical University (Erasmus+ code: PL WROCLAW05), which has not yet been finalized.

Article 5 - Acceptance of the Mobility Grant

By the date indicated in the notice of publication of the ranking list, the selected student must formally accept the mobility grant by sending an email to erasmus@unicamillus.org, failure to do so will result in exclusion.

Following acceptance, the Erasmus Office will forward the student's name to the host University in accordance with the deadlines set by the latter.

Acceptance of the mobility opportunity constitutes a serious commitment on the part of the candidate. After acceptance, or at the beginning of the mobility period, students may withdraw only in cases of serious and proven force majeure, which must be communicated in writing and properly justified, so as to allow the first reserve candidate to take their place in a timely manner.

Failure to accept within the deadline will be considered a withdrawal.

Note: The student's participation in the mobility program is, in any case, subject to acceptance by the host University, which may request additional certifications/documents or even reject the application.

Article 6 – Withdrawal and Replacement

The student awarded the Erasmus+ Scholarship, if they decide to renounce the scholarship, is required to promptly communicate their Withdrawal from the Mobility to the Erasmus Office at: erasmus@unicamillus.org.

The communication must be sent exclusively from the institutional email account provided to each student.

The University reserves the right to assign the remaining available places either by ranking list progression or through the publication of a new call for applications.

The holder of the Erasmus+ Scholarship will forfeit it in the event of any of the following:

- loss of student status;
- withdrawal of the Erasmus+ Scholarship;
- any duly justified reason rendering the student ineligible to continue the mobility period abroad.

Please Note: Withdrawal from the scholarship awarded under this Call, after initial acceptance, will result in exclusion from any subsequent selections, unless the Faculty Erasmus Delegate deems that the reasons provided are compatible with a new application.

Article 7 – Mobility Procedures

Article 7.1 - Before departure

Before departure, students must:

- complete and sign the Learning Agreement;
- sign the Mobility Grant Agreement.

Learning Agreement (LA) – Following the formal acceptance of the scholarship, the student must complete the official study plan, the Learning Agreement, which defines the academic activities to be undertaken at the host institution and ensures the recognition of credits obtained upon passing the exams. To fill out the proposal, it is necessary to access the OLA (Online Learning Agreement) portal at <https://learning-agreement.eu/> and create a personal Mobility profile, which will remain valid for future mobility opportunities.

The completed Learning Agreement, signed by the student, must be validated by acceptance from the Degree Program Coordinator. Subsequently, it must also be approved by the designated contact at the host University. Acceptance by the host University is an essential requirement.

It should be noted that, at the end of the mobility period, only the exams listed in the Learning Agreement will be eligible for recognition, provided they have been successfully passed.

Mobility Financial Agreement – This agreement will be completed by the student at the time of acceptance of the chosen host institution. The agreement will include personal and financial information and must be signed by both the University and the student before departure. The student will receive a copy of the signed agreement.

Article 7.2 - After return

After return, within 15 days students must submit:

- Certificate of Attendance;
- Transcript of Records (if applicable);
- Participant Report via EU platform.

Article 8 – Minimum Credits to be Earned

Upon indication of the European Commission, UniCamillus University requires participating students in the Programme to obtain a minimum number of credits at the host university, which will be recognized by UniCamillus in accordance with the approved Learning Agreement.

Upon return, the student must proceed with the recognition of at least 3 ECTS credits; failure to do so will result in the loss of the Erasmus grant and Erasmus student status.

If the student has already obtained the credits deriving from elective courses, the 3 ECTS credits may be recognized as extra credits (crediti sovranumerari) – valid only for Msc in Medicine & Surgery. Such credits will not be included in the calculation of the grade average and will not count toward the total number of credits required for the award of the degree.

Article 9 – Student Responsibilities

The student is required to independently complete all registration procedures requested by the host University, following the procedures and deadlines established by the latter. The student must also independently arrange accommodation for the study period abroad, or contact the host University to check the availability of dormitories and/or housing search services.

Furthermore, the student must:

- Check the website of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation for any travel advisories regarding safety and risk situations at the host location: <https://www.viaggiare Sicuri.it>;
- Review and accept any mobility conditions set by the host University;
- Arrange for travel insurance covering cancellations or delays due to epidemics, pandemics, or other force majeure events;
- Independently verify the entry visa requirements for the destination country, particularly for non-EU students and/or EU students traveling to a European country outside the Schengen area;
- Independently obtain information regarding healthcare services in the host country, contacting their local health authority (ASL) or diplomatic representations. Students are advised to check, prior to departure, the extent of National Health Service coverage in the host country. Basic healthcare and access to national healthcare services in EU member countries is generally ensured through the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). It is the student's responsibility to obtain the card if they do not already have it, if it has expired, or if it has been lost. Please note that coverage and reimbursement for medical care/hospitalization may vary by country;
- Be properly enrolled at UniCamillus University for the 2026/2027 academic year, ensuring that all tuition installments are paid in accordance with the deadlines set by the Fees and

Contributions Regulations, or at least before the start of the Erasmus mobility period. The selected student will be exempt from paying tuition fees at the host University.

Accident and Liability Insurance

The accident and liability insurance coverage provided to the student through enrollment at UniCamillus is extended, under the same conditions, for the entire duration of the stay abroad at the host institution.

Online Linguistic Support (OLS)

Erasmus+ strengthens support for mobility participants in improving their foreign language skills before and during their stay abroad through a European Online Linguistic Support (OLS) service. This service allows participants to assess their knowledge of the language they will use for their studies abroad and to follow a free online language course to enhance their skills.

To take the language assessment and participate in the language courses, students must register on the EU Academy platform.

Article 10 – Financial Contribution

10.1 – Disbursement of the Financial Grant

Eligible students will be awarded an Erasmus Short Mobility scholarship to cover mobility expenses during the in-person activity, amounting to €79.00 per day.

Regarding the general timing of grant disbursement, UniCamillus University will release the amount corresponding to the individual support at the end of the physical mobility period, after the student completes the Participant Report. For students with fewer opportunities, the TOP-UP and the Travel Grant will also be provided.

10.2 – Travel Grant

The Erasmus 2021-27 Program provides a Green Travel grant for journeys made using sustainable transportation modes such as bicycle, bus, carpooling, and train. Unit travel grants for sustainable transport (eco-friendly travel) are eligible if these modes were used for the majority of the outbound/return trip and properly documented.

For a “standard” trip (using air travel), a unit grant is provided based on distance bands: the amount paid covers the round-trip journey between the place of departure and the destination. This amount is calculated once per distance band.

The distance must be verified using only the distance calculator provided by the European Commission, available at: https://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/resources/distance-calculator_en.

10.3 – Additional Grant for Students with Fewer Opportunities

An ERASMUS+ financial grant of €100 (TOP-UP) is provided once to eligible candidates with fewer opportunities who fall into one of the following categories:

- Economically disadvantaged, as evidenced by the ISEE1 certificate;
- Orphan of at least one parent before reaching the age of 18;
- Participant with certified physical, mental, or health issues (medical certificate);
- Participant with minor children;
- Participant who is a child of victims of terrorism or organized crime;
- Participant who is a professional athlete.

The award of this grant is based on a self-declaration by the participant (to be sent via email to erasmus@unicamillus.org from their institutional email address by the application deadline) along with the relevant supporting documentation. Failure to submit the required documentation will result in the forfeiture of the grant.

Article 11 – Students with Disabilities and Inclusive Education

In accordance with the provisions of the Erasmus+ Programme establishing decision, and in order to promote broader participation in mobility programs, the Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE may provide an additional financial grant for students with disabilities who submit a request. These are funds allocated by the European Commission for individuals with specific physical, mental, or health conditions. Access to this support requires submitting a specific request to the University Erasmus+ Office, following the procedures and deadlines established by the Erasmus+ National Agency INDIRE.

It is standard practice that the home institution ensures that the host institution takes the necessary measures to meet the particular needs of the student, provided that the student has communicated their physical, mental, or health conditions.
