### EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

Elective Courses (or Optional Activities) are designed to expand students' disciplinary and/or transversal knowledge and skills, enhancing their preparation and individual training in accordance with their personal interests. - develop competencies in planning their professional and educational future.

## TEACHING METHODS

The elective activities correspond to a total of 42 hours of learning, equivalent to 3 ECTS. Each student must select the elective activities of their interest from those offered by the Didactic Office, in order to complete the required 3 ECTS for the third year of the course.

The Didactic Office organizes the elective activities at the beginning of each semester. Students may also propose elective activities consistent with the educational objectives of the Degree Program, provided that they do not overlap with scheduled coursework and are conducted in person.

## METHODS OF ASSESSMENT

Assessment will be conducted orally and will evaluate the student’s ability to demonstrate the required knowledge, consistent with the objectives and program of the attended activities.

The evaluation will also consider the student’s autonomy of judgment, communication skills, and learning ability.

<b>FAIL</b>	Fragmentary and superficial knowledge of the content, errors in applying concepts, poor presentation.
<b>PASS</b>	At least sufficient and appropriate knowledge of the content, clear and coherent presentation.
